

Sergey Dubinin



Sergey Dubinin is born in Moscow in 1950.

In 1973 he graduated from Moscow State University Lomonosov, with a degree in political economy, qualification - economist, teacher of political economy.

In 1983, he became an associate professor in the department of foreign economics, and in 1991 received a doctorate in economics. Professor.

From 1991 to 1992 he worked as an economic expert in the Office of the President of the USSR. Then was Deputy chairman of the Russian State Committee for Economic Cooperation with the CIS member states.

From 1993 to 1994, he served as First Deputy Minister of Finance of Russia.

In 1994, he became the First Deputy Chairman of the board of the commercial bank Imperial.

In 1995, he became a member of the Gazprom Management Committee. Since 1995, for three years he has been Chairman of the Central Bank of the Russian Federation (CBR). During his leadership of the Central Bank was held a denomination of the ruble. In 1998, he became Deputy Chairman of Gazprom.

From 2001 to 2004, he worked at RAO "UES of Russia", first as Deputy Chairman of the board, then became a member of the Board and financial director.

From October 1, 2008 to the present - member of the Board of Directors of CJSC VTB Capital. From June 16, 2011 - Chairman of the Supervisory Board of VTB Bank. Since July 1, 2011, he is an advisor to CJSC VTB Capital.

February 10, 2014 headed the department of "Finance and Credit" of the Faculty of Economics of Moscow State University Lomonosov.

He was a member of the Supervisory Board of OJSC AK Alrosa, the Board of Directors of OJSC Otkritie Financial Company, and ion the boards of directors of VTB Capital, LLC "Holding VTB Capital IB" and CJSC "Holding VTB Capital". Currently he is a member of Supervisory Board of "Pochta Bank".
