THE EXPANSION OF THE GLOBAL  
ECONOMY AND TRADE

Russia has the longest Arctic border  
at 22,600 kilometres, and hosts 43%  
of the Arctic region

More than 22% of all Russian exports, representing  
11% of national income, originate in the Russian  
Federation's Arctic zone

The Northern Sea Route is the most important  
route for Russian and international shipping in the  
Arctic. More than 5 million tonnes of cargo are  
delivered via this route annually

More than 700 oil and gas fields, as well as  
non-ferrous and precious metal deposits,  
including over 350 gold deposits, are located  
in Arctic territory

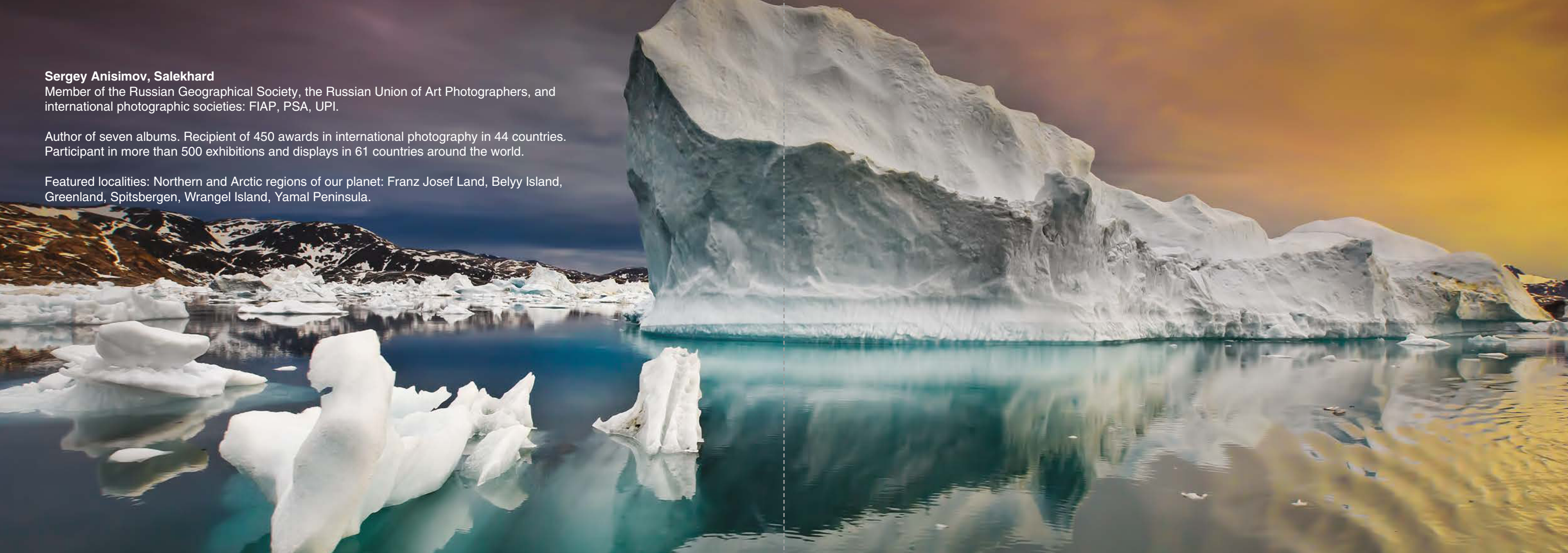

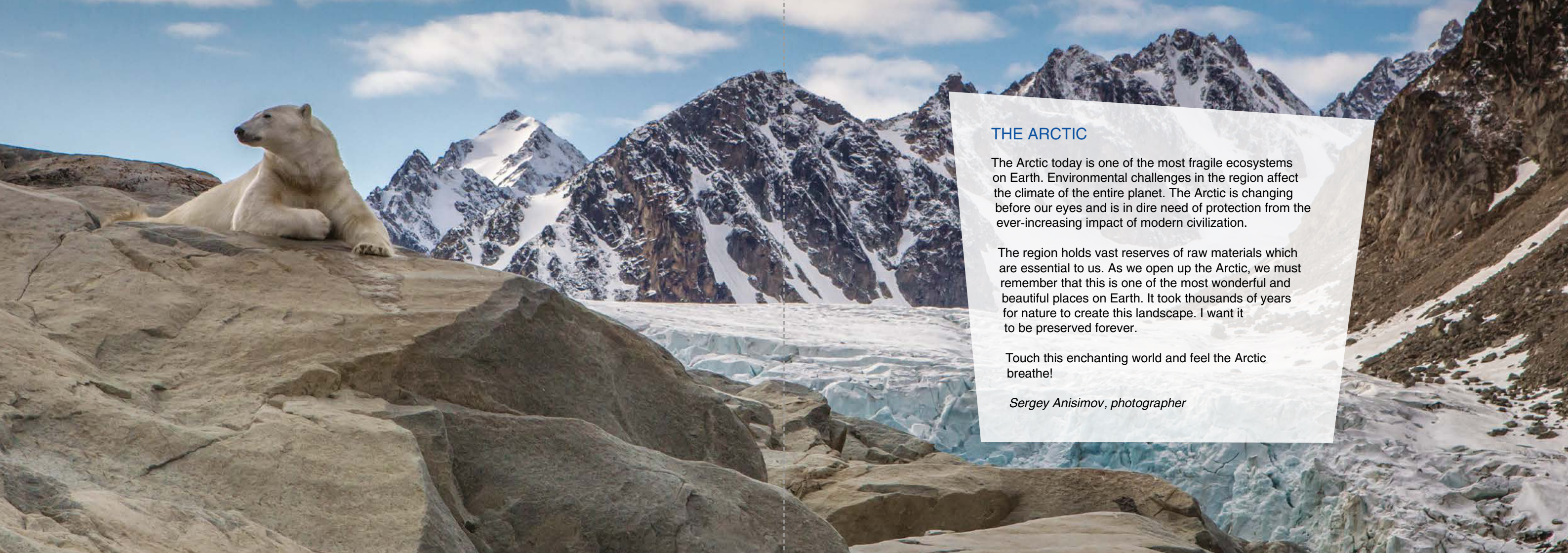
Member of the Russian Geographical Society, the Russian Union of Art Photographers, and international photographic societies: FIAP, PSA, UPI.
