Why Safety matters!



- 3.000 people die every day due to work related accidents or 1 million every year
- Over 500.000 accidents per day cause absence from work
- 10 billion US\$ net cost a year attributed to absence from work alone
- 10 fold this amount related to productivity losses

Creating a Culture of Safety





Personal Protective Equipment(PPE)



Employer must provide:

- PPE in accordance with the SNiP standards;
- Control over the PPE provided to works;
- Safety control system of works at height;

- Functioning systems check of safe work at height;
- Replacement of elements with reduced protective properties.

PPE protecting of falling from height are subject to obligatory testing and certification









NOT ALLOWED:

- Use of PPE without approved technical documentation;
- Workers without compulsory or with defective PPE to work at height.



Key behaviors due to planning

- Knowledge of safety procedures
- Continued training & education
- Reporting and thorough analysis of accidents
- Absence of ill-health behaviors
- Tolerance of error/corrective action
- Open communication strategy
- Absence of a 'blame' culture





The hierarchy of risk reduction

How to stay safe:

- Predict any potential risks and anticipate all preventive safety measures.
- Design with consideration for hazard elimination and ensure safety.
- Plan and provide considered preventive measures and stay safe.

Auditing by external auditing team

Zero tolerance for unsafe behavior's

RCA process after all incidents and all

'near miss' situations

Adherence to safe work

- Contractor integration






