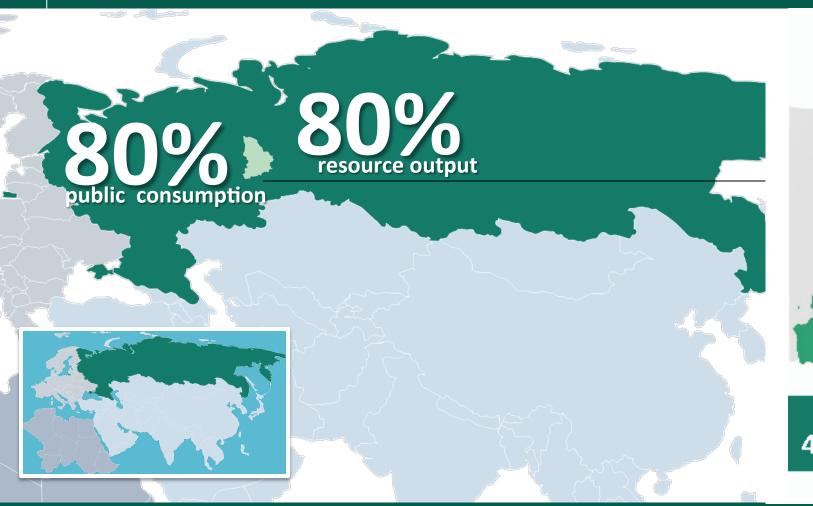


TAD vs SEZ: pros and cons

Titanium Valley Special Economic Zone

Favorable economic environment and infrastructure for Russian and foreign entrepreneurs

Best suited for manufacturing machinery and equipment, as well as titanium based aircraft parts and medical equipment Located in Verkhnyaya Salda – 170 km from Yekaterinburg; 30 km from the city of Nizhny Tagil

Total area: 584 hectares

Hazard class: III - V

Special tax treatment:

Income tax - 2% (compared to 20% across Russia)

Property tax - 0% (compared to 2.2% across Russia)

Land tax - 0% (compared to 1.5% across Russia)

Reduced vehicle tax rate

Import duty - 0% (compared to 5-20% across Russia)

VAT - 0% (compared to 10-18% across Russia)



Bogoslovsky Industrial Park

Industrial territory with well-developed infrastructure offering tax incentives and zero connection charges

Best suited for metal-intensive productions, manufacturers of construction materials and other manufacturers catering to the oil and gas extraction regions of Russia

Located in the town of Krasnoturyinsk—380 km from

Yekaterinburg;

700 km from Khanty-Mansiysk

Total area: 86 hectares

Hazard class: I - V (1000 m protective zone)

Special tax treatment:

Income tax - 5%–10% (compared to 20% across Russia)

Property tax - 0% (compared to 2.2% across Russia)

Land tax - 0% (compared to 1.5% across Russia)

Insurance premiums - 7.6% (compared to 30% across Russia)



SEZ vs TAD

Why TAD?

- Lower operating costs because of lower social security payments and taxes (corporate, property);
- TOR is a territory of the monotown in a whole you can make a JV with existings companies.
- No problems with staff people already live nearby;
- Agriculture projects are allowed;
- **Preferencial funding** of Fund for monotowns development
 - co-investing;
 - 5% interest rate loans.

SEZ vs TADWhy SEZ?

- Lower costs for equipment on investment stage no VAT and import Duties;
- **Better procedures** more than 10 years of practice with SEZ vs less than 2 years with TAD;
- Better for export;
- "Ready for use" most of SEZ have completed infrastructure construction (and it's new!)

3 mistakes investors do

easy check-list for your project at very beginning

- 1) Do not focus only on industrial park/business park in TAD you can choose any site you want:
 - TAD is status for a whole city, not for special site;
 - it's a common mistake because regions mostly promote industrial parks.
- 2) Check that your project could be implemented in SEZ/TADA you have chosen
 - extremely dangerous production is not allowed in SEZ
 - each TAD has its own specific list of industries for which incentives will be provided (for example, you cant refine oil in any TAD)
- 3) Pay attention on staff for your project:
 - TADs are usually full of staff with the same specialization as city-forming enterprise need – define with region administration special training programs;
 - SEZs are usually far from cities discuss with region administration how to provide housing for staff

One more tip

for your project



Combine your SEZ/TAD status with other incentives:

- special investment contract;
- federal and regional subsidies;
- special funds and organization which provide preferential funding.

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
