Heads of state and government, representatives of major international energy firms and sector leaders, renowned experts, scientists, and journalists all take part in the Forum.

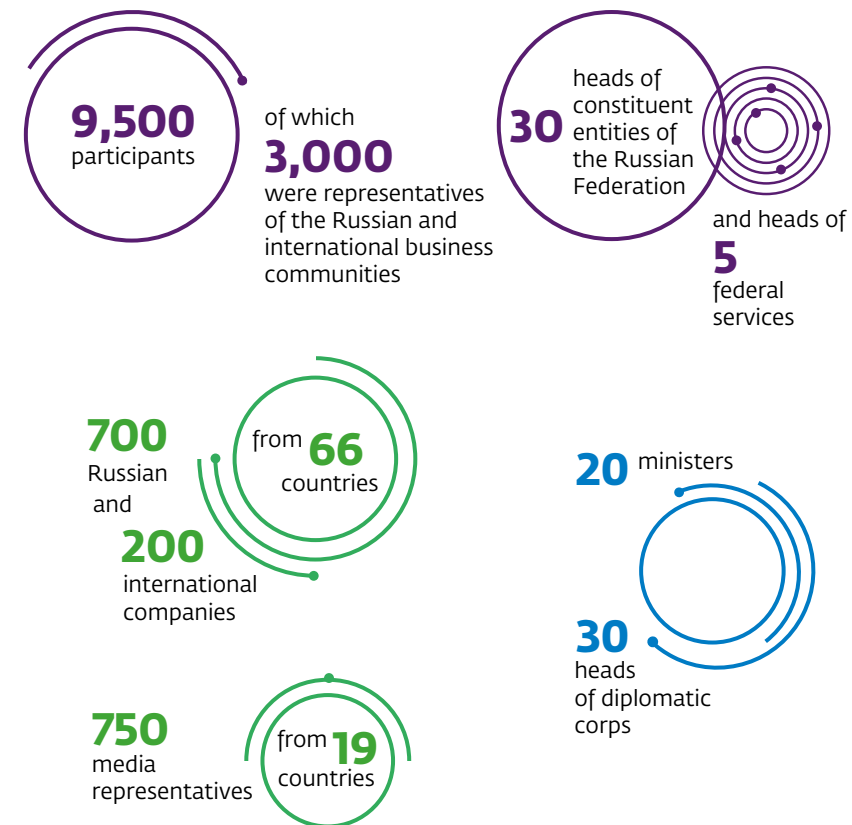
The Forum is held with the support of the Ministry of the Russian Federation and Moscow City Government.

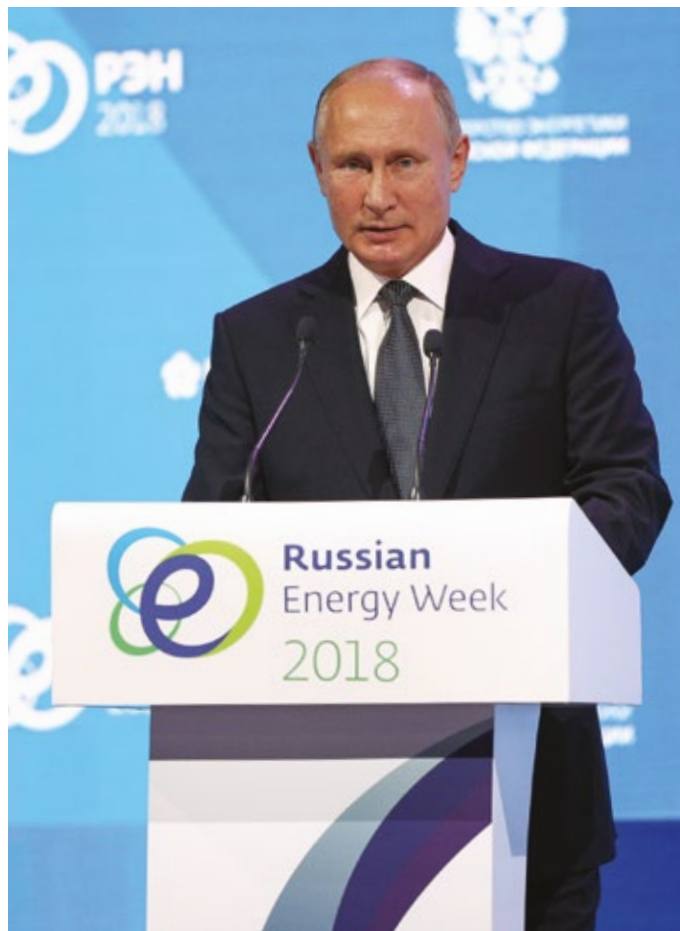

The key theme for Russian Energy Week (REW) 2018 was 'Sustainable Energy for a Changing World'. The plenary session was opened by President of the Russian Federation Vladimir Putin.

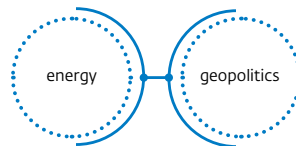

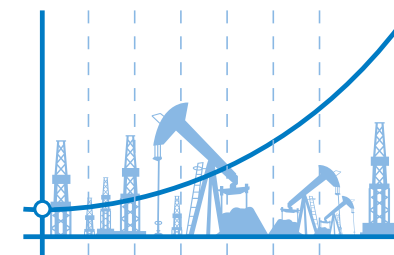

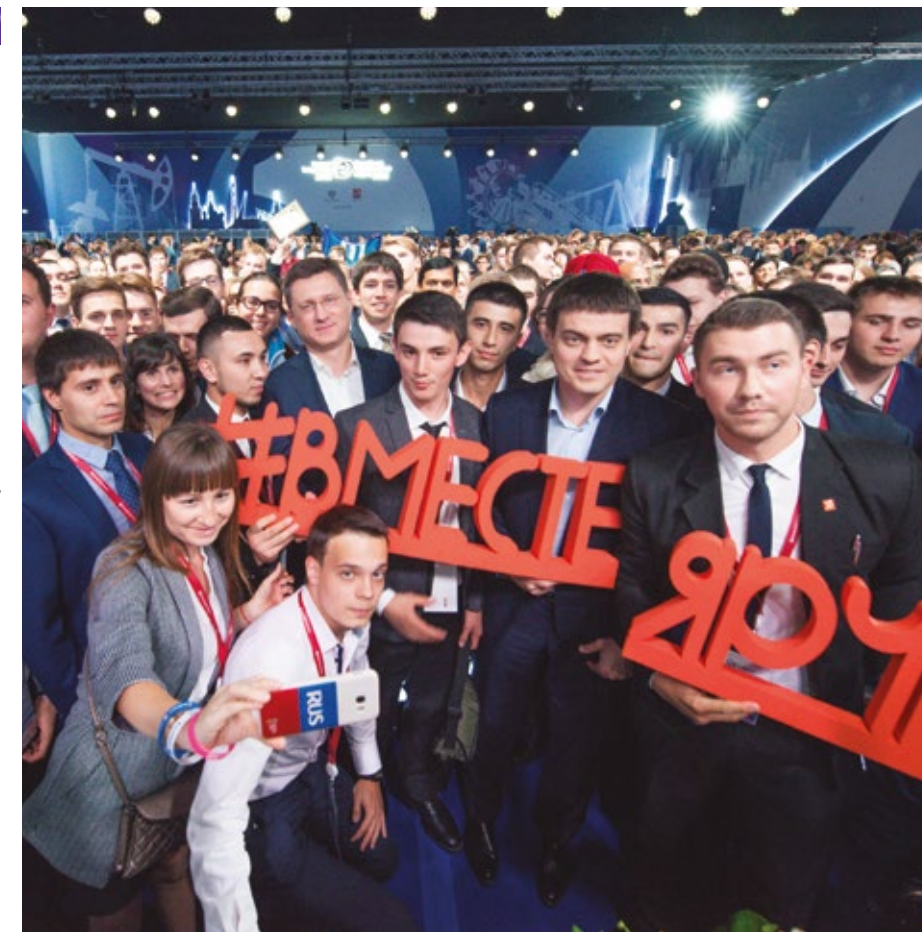

At Russian Energy Week 2019, there will be a considerable focus on the international agenda, the activities of the UN, the Gas Exporting Countries Forum, industry innovation projects, and the training of a competitive pool of candidates for the industry. The Russia-wide meeting on preparations for and the execution of the heating season in autumn and winter 2019–2020 will also be held.
