Import substitution program

Regulations on import substitution as of 31.03.2015

- Automotive industry
- Civil-aircraft production
- Cable and electrical industry

Import substitution program

- Examples:

Product/Technology	Import dependency in 2014 (%)	Import dependency in 2020 (%)
CNC lathes	90	60
Drilling machines	80	61
Grinding machines	97	85
Industrial robots and	95	69

Electric motors	100	86



Federal law 488-FZ "On industrial policy"

- Goal

 Promotion of local production, diversification of economy, distribution of tasks between federal and regional levels, creation of general frameworks for industry development programs

"Carrot"

- Government incentives, i.a. Special investment contracts
- Guarantee for stability: immunity for investors from later legislation changes

"Stick"

- Preferences for local products (EEU)
- Restriction or exclusion of foreign goods in procurements or tenders of state agencies and state-owned enterprises (>50%)



Russian industrial policy





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Access restrictions for foreign goods on public procurements

Type of goods	Type of restriction
Regulation No. 656: Cars, other vehicles (including street cleaning vehicles), heavy equipment	Exclusion of foreign products from procurements
Regulation No. 1289: Strategically important and essential medicines	Foreign applications are excluded from participation if min. 2 local applications are submitted; 15% penalty rule
Regulation No. 791: Foreign light industry (textiles)	Exclusion of foreign products from procurements
Regulation No. 1236: Foreign software	Generally only Russian or EEU software can be procured
Regulation No. 968: IT hardware and electronics (e.g. keyboards, printers, cash points, payment terminals, video cameras, dictation devices, LED light bulbs)	Foreign applications are excluded from participation if min. 2 local applications are submitted
Regulation No. 925: Priority of Russian products and services (effective from 1.1.2017)	15% penalty for foreign goods and services accounting ERP import legal tax 8

Radio electronics (Government Regulation No. 968 as of 29.06.2016)



Food (Government Regulation No. 832 as of 22.08.2016)



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Applies for 2 years as of 14.12.2017



Public procurement market

- Two types of procurements in Russia





Participation in procurements of state-owned enterprises

- Russian/EEU products have priority in procurements of state-owned enterprises
- Two types of prioritization:
 - <u>Competition</u>: local product is estimated with a 15% deduction from actual price
 - <u>Auction</u>: agreement with a foreign provider is concluded with a deduction of 15% from the original price
- According to the GATT, such prioritization shall only be applied in certain fields

 Special investment agreement: contractually agreed criteria



- Regulation No. 719 as of 17.07.2015: criteria for products from the following branches:
 - Photonics and lighting industry
 - Heavy equipment industry
 - (from 2017) Pharmaceutical industry
 - Electrical engineering and power industry
- Toolmaking industry
- Automotive industry
- Special machines industry etc.
- Other products: Criteria according to CIS agreement as of November 20, 2009



Requirements for products "Made in Russia"

- Criteria according to Regulation No. 719
 - Criteria are product-specific
 - Maximum rate (%) of foreign raw materials and components of the cost of manufacturing final product
 - Implementation of certain production processes in Russia
 - Right of the producer for design and technical documentation of the product
 - Service centre in one of the member states of the EEU

Requirements for products "Made in Russia"

Criteria in Regulation No. 719



- Example: Vehicles
 - Localization criterion Implementation of certain production processes in Russia, e.g.:
 - Motor fitting, front and rear suspension, exhaust system, steering gear, electronic devices, interior and exterior parts
 - Welding
 - Car body painting and fitting
 - Final check of finished vehicles
 - Number of necessary production processes increases from year to year (2015: 7; 2016: 9; from 2017: min. 11 production steps localized in Russia necessary)



Requirements for products "Made in Russia"

- Criteria (according to CIS agreement) are product-specific:
 - Change of customs tariff number within the first 4 positions
 - Certain technical requirements for production processes
 - Requirements for imported components / materials (only certain imported materials are permitted)
 - Ad valorem rule (maximum value of imported raw materials in final product)



Requirements for products "Made in Russia"

- Criteria according to CIS agreement (examples)
 - HS group 87 vehicle parts:
 Ad valorem share should be not less 50%
 - Customs tariff number 851650000 microwave ovens:
 - Necessary production processes:
 - Production of housings and electric components
 - Fitting and installation
 - Regulation and control of parameters / options
